

## Reckless Lo Specchio Dei Mondi I Grandi

The volume strives at shedding light on the complexity of the relationship between early modern and ancient literature, perfectly summed up in the motto written by Pietro Aretino in a letter to his friend the painter Giulio Romano in 1542: "Essere modernamente antichi e anticamente moderni".

In 1978 Sontag wrote *Illness As Metaphor*.
